They called it “unsinkable” but the *titanic* was not they called it a floating luxury hotel and indeed it was! it was like a grand palace with huge rooms gold-plated light fixtures a swimming pool and steam baths. no ship this big or beautiful had ever been built before hundreds of passengers boarded the *titanic* in Southampton England on April 10 1912. The great new Ship was bound for new york on its maiden voyage.

At a half hour past midnight on April 15 1912 disaster struck the *titanic* actually the ship struck disaster in the form of an iceberg. At first passengers didnt realize that the accident was serious there was a command for people to get into the lifeboats. Unfortunately the company that built the boat was so convinced it was unsinkable that they had sent lifeboats for only about half of the people on board.

The ship sent out distress signals hoping nearby ships would come to help the bow of the *titanic* was sinking when a loud roaring noise went up from the ship. the *titanic* was breaking apart it stood up in the air for a short time soon to disappear beneath the waves. The next day another ship the *Carpathia* came to rescue 712 survivors. hundreds more did not survive.

There are many theories about why the *titanic* sank seventy-five years later after much searching the ships wreckage was found. small submarines have explored the wreckage. Maybe some of the mysteries of this disaster will now be solved.
